Trading in and returns on the Spanish strips market from its inception to 2003

An analysis of the origin of these instruments and the development of their trading volume on the Spanish public debt market is followed by a study of the performance of their interest rates on the spot market, compared to the theoretical zero-coupon rates for non-stripped bonds. This comparison provides an indication of whether the interest rates on stripped debt spot operations are in line with the rates prevailing on the medium- and long-term government bond market.
